What is work?

Personal values

Different people consider ***different values*** to be more or less important.



Sometimes people can hold ***similar values***, but can act on these in different ways. They may act on these through their career choice, or through other actions in their daily lives.



We know that people hold a variety of values as individuals, but communities and organisations can hold ***shared values*** too. Sometimes when we share values, we feel more motivated and positive about our work.

How do we make sure the jobs we do will match your skills, abilities and aspirations?

Essentially, you need three things to be (really) successful at work:

ability - aspiration - attitude.

Ability is your knowledge, skills, intellect and talents. *You can improve these.*

Aspirations to focus on what motivates you. *You can find these if you look*

Attitude to be driven (focused) and hungry (determined). *You can develop and improve this.*
