What is respect?

Respect is very important in school and in the wider community.

Respect means treating people the way you would like to be treated.

It means respecting people's differences and understanding why people are the way they are.

It means considering other people's rights, whoever they are.

It means thinking carefully about the way that we speak and behave towards other people.

What are rules and laws?

Rules are "guidelines" that apply in schools, communities and at home. They are things that we are expected to do as members of a community or family. There are consequences for breaking these rules, which are decided by the leaders of the school or parents/ carers in a family.

Laws are rules that are made by the government, which all citizens of a country are expected to abide by. The consequences for breaking these laws can be very serious.

Top Tips for successful teamwork!

- Listen to each other – everyone's views are important.
- Encourage quieter members of the group to contribute to the task.
- Think about how to use different people's skills and strengths.
- Come up with a plan – work out what it is you need to do, and how you might go about doing it.
- Identify problems or barriers – think about how you can work together to solve the problem.
